The 4th grade vegetable garden is home to green beans, cauliflower, tomatoes and even pineapples. About two months ago, the class took soil samples that were sent off to the University of Florida for some testing to make sure it was ready for planting. After the results and some added nutrients, the planting began. Just after one month, we are seeing huge growth in all of them, can't wait for the day we get to pick and try!

The 5th grade is designed as a pollinator garden and just needed some sprucing up after a year lacking attention. Tresdon, one of our students drew a new layout, moving some of the pots and bistro style tables, plus adding additional plants he researched. Did we mention, he did all of this on his own and presented it to his teachers? When we say our students love gardening, that is a huge understatement. The class spent time weeding and planting new pollinator focused flowers and herbs. Now they are working on upkeep with water and of course enjoying their bistro tables for quiet lunches and reading.
