Alumni Spotlight: Leo Schoolfield

Leo arrived at Chi Chi's as a 4th grader desperately in need of support emotionally, socially and academically. Though he had a supportive family they were also in crisis and couldn't provide all the things Leo needed. Leo says at the Chi Chi Academy he found a family environment with people who convinced him he was worthwhile and that he could succeed, something he had never thought possible. In May of 2018, Leo walked across a stage for his high school diploma from Anclote High School with a 3.87 GPA. After graduation, he joined the Navy and in November moved to San Diego for 18 months of training before he heads to Japan for his first station assignment. The week before he left for San Diego, Leo and his mom visited Chi Chi's and spoke with the current students about how they can also succeed in their future. Student eyes and hearts were wide open to Leo's message because not too long ago he had sat in the same desk as they were now. We are immensely proud of the young man Leo has become and look forward to his continued connection with the students as he moves along on his personal Journey to Success.
