

Student Spotlight: 8th Graders Field Trip to Finance Park Provides Life Lessons

Following classroom preparation, the 8th grade class joined other students from Pinellas County for a realistic lesson at Stravos Institute's Finance Park. During their day at the Park, each student must balance their own monthly financial budget based on a simulated "life experience," including transportation, investment, home improvement, banking, housing, entertainment, healthcare, utilities, food, home furnishings, clothing and education. iPads were added to the program this year making it more engaging and our students loved the addition. Working within a group structure with a chaperone, students develop important life lessons like personal finance concepts and the advantages of saving and investing.
