The golf course living classroom delivers again! Students enjoyed an up close and personal experience with nature in a way that delights and teaches lessons in a unique way. The 4th grade class was escorted by Brian Beckner of Native Bird Boxes, Golf Club Superintendent Eric Dixon and Foundation staff for a wildlife education tour introducing them to the many different animals that call the course their home. Following their expedition, Brian and Eric went over all the different types of animals they experienced. The students' favorite part was petting a baby owl pulled from one of the homes students created for them on the course.

In 2014, students built 22 different bird boxes for their golf course classroom. The boxes are home to wood peckers, blue birds, screech owls, flying squirrels and more. Students are able to monitor and hear from experts as part of their science curriculum.
