The Tampa Bay Lightning honored Frank Chivas as the 43rd Lightning Community Hero this season during the first period of Game 2 versus the Columbus Blue Jackets at Amalie Arena. Chivas, who received a \$50,000 award from the Lightning Foundation and the Lightning Community Heroes program, shared the donation equally among the Chi Chi Rodriguez Youth Foundation, Clearwater Marine Aquarium and Clearwater for Youth.

Chivas is best known for his stable of restaurants – Island Way Grill, Salt Rock Grill, Marlin' Darlin, Rumba, Salt Rock Tavern and the Marina Cantina. When he was 11 he lost his father, a commercial fisherman, and was placed into foster care. This drove him to become devoted to helping children in need. Now he works with multiple Tampa Bay charities, including the Chi Chi Rodriguez Youth Foundation where he has served on the Board of Directors since 2006. In honor of his work with these organizations and the community, Frank was also named Mr. Clearwater at the 93rd annual meeting of the Clearwater Regional Chamber of Commerce.

Frank Chivas becomes the 368th Lightning Community Hero since Jeff and Penny Vinik introduced the Lightning Community Hero program in 2011-12. Through this game, in total, the Lightning Foundation has granted \$18.4 million to more than 400 different nonprofits in the Greater Tampa Bay area.
